


2022 Report Card on Child and Family Poverty in Canada

Pandemic lessons: Ending child and family poverty is possible

During the COVID-19 pandemic,
Canada's child poverty rate dropped
by 40%. This progress was largely
due to temporary pandemic benefits.

Temporary pandemic benefits protected 542,980 children in every province and territory from falling into poverty in the first year of the pandemic.

Pandemic benefits have all been retracted and this progress is unlikely to continue The federal government must take action to maintain and build on these gains in poverty reduction
